What Not Shop



Established in 1971, by the Hope Auxiliary. The What Not Shop began with volunteers making and selling crafts, food, and donated items, with the intentions of raising funds to build a new group home. The location of the What Not Shop began as a once a month rummage sale in the building formerly owned by Henry

Schmersal at his Barber Shop in Mexico, Maine.

In 1976, the What Not Shop moved to Waldo Street in Rumford where it established itself as a staple of our community and remained until 2005 when it moved into its present location, with its own entrance and parking area, here at our main office, 85 Lincoln Avenue Rumford.

The What Not Shop's success relies on its great team and the generosity of our community's donation of clean, intact, and gently used items. All income generated by the What Not Shop is applied towards the services, needs, and goals of the individuals for whom the Hope Association provides services. In return, Hope Association has supported its community by making winter and other needed items available to schools who have reached out and to the Larry Labonte Center and other local established organizations supporting people in need. It has supported people, with a documented need, to find professional clothing to aide in job searches, and has donated overflow items to other organizations such as the Salvation Army, Goodwill, Free stores, and pantries.

The team at the What Not Shop, consists of staff experience ranging from 18 years (Miss Cathy Gaccetta) to just a few months, and are always good, front and center, for a smile, a welcome, and impeccable customer service for new comers and for returning customers, many of whom they know by name and interests. Not only will they help you locate items in the store that match what a customer may be looking for, they will also take note of specific items they think you may be interested in and notify you if something comes to their attention that you've asked them to keep an eye out for.

"We've even helped theater groups find costumes for their productions", shares MaryCarol, one of the What Not Shop's invaluable team members.

Behind the scenes, the What Not Shop team is just as wonderful with sorting through, categorizing, folding, hanging, pricing, placing, and storing the many bobbles, and gadgets, and boxes and bags of donations that the What Not Shop is blessed with,



As always, due to safety and liability the What Not Shop cannot accept, and will have to discard of donations that are broken or dirty as, well as weapons, knives, and baby car seats according to state law. Please call ahead if wanting to donate larger items that may require more storage space.
